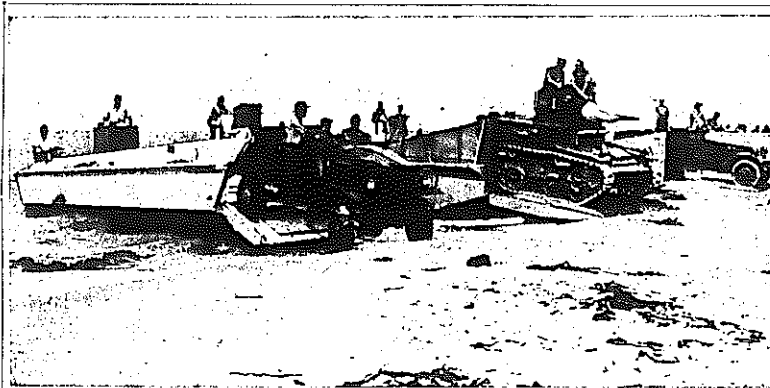

Foe Unable To Smash To Smash Inland From Coast Area

Defenders Face Great Odds

WASHINGTON (AP)—Fighting against huge odds, a beleaguered force of American-Filipino troops was reported today to be holding the Japanese at bay on the south-central Philippine island of Cebu.

Despite the weight of numbers and the crushing force of tanks and dive bombers supporting their drive, the enemy apparently had been unable to push their way inland from the coastal area which they seized with lightning at the end of last Friday.

The fate of the Cebu defenders had been a matter of almost speculation since communication between the island and Cebu had been cut off for more than three days ago but the eventual triumph of communications and reports of stubborn resistance to the invaders were disclosed in a communique this morning.

The enemy force, comprising about 200 miles south of Cebu, since last Friday was estimated at 12,000 men and ships, one of which—a large ship—was sunk by the Cebu defenders.

The communique reported that the enemy had been unable to push their way inland from the coastal area which they seized with lightning at the end of last Friday.

Berlin Believed To Have Jitters About Allied Attack

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Smash 13 Jap Planes

RAF Hits Isles While Yanks Score in Burma

NEW DELHI (AP)—American and British forces have struck strong blows in the defense of India, shattered by a Japanese fleet of three battleships, five aircraft carriers and other warships in the Bay of Bengal, according to three British planes in the Andaman Islands and attacking an airplane in Burma, it was announced today.

Thirteen flying boats used by the Japanese for long-range scouting and bombing were sunk, set afire or damaged when the RAF struck 200 miles across the Bay of Bengal and found them anchored in the harbor at Port Blair in the Andaman Islands, potential outposts for an Indian invasion of the British Isles.

Another communique said the Japanese lost seven aircraft when the Indian forces attacked Japanese planes in the Bay of Bengal.

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Six Soviet Divisions Reported in Big Attack

Battle Still In Progress

LONDON (AP)—Exchange Telegraph said today the German radio had announced that six Soviet divisions, including a Siberian division and an entire division of tanks had launched an attack of extreme violence on the central Russian front and that the battle still was in progress.

It said other Russian attacks also were made against Rumanian and Italian positions in the Danube Basin to the South.

The German broadcast was said to have acknowledged that the Russians had broken through at some points but to have claimed that the attack was stemmed and the attackers partly annihilated.

Fleet May Go To Germans

PARIS (AP)—The French Government, which ousted Pierre Laval, made a place today for the return of France's leading exponent of collaboration and, at the same time, suspended the Rion trials of France's Republican leaders, to which Hitler himself had objected.

Marshal Petain, it was announced, decided to form a new government with Laval and Admiral Jean Darlan, who has been Vice-Premier since Laval's ouster.

The announcement said the three leaders met today and decided on "the constitution of a government established on the foundations" of their new meeting.

The meeting was set for Thursday when, presumably, the three leaders and Darlan will be allotted.

Suspension DECEASED

On the day that the three leaders were to have resumed after Easter recess, a special law of amnesties was passed to permit broadening of the scope to include political as well as military "mistakes which led to war and defeat" for the Third Republic.

The immediate reaction in London was that the United Nations had suffered a diplomatic defeat in their attempt to sway France from collaboration with Germany.
