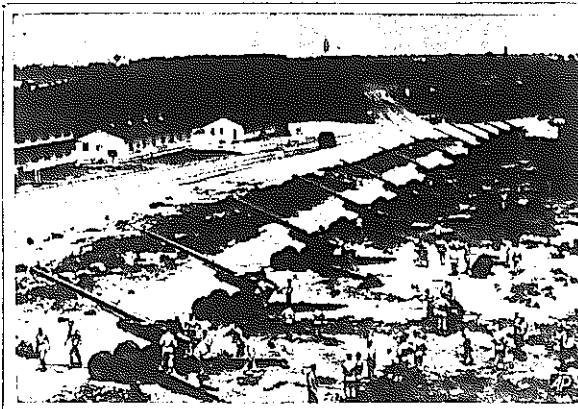
Attack Jap Airdromes
