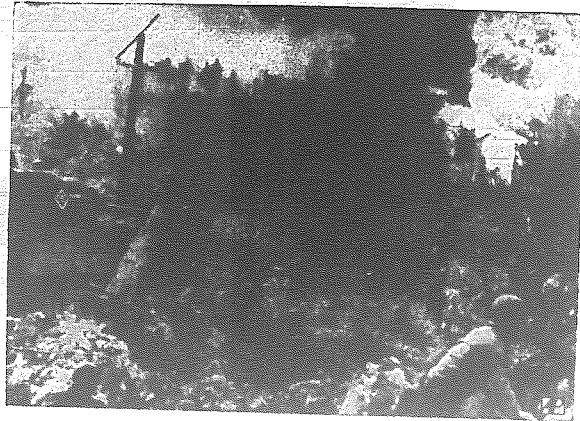

Japs Flee In Burma

SOUTHEAST ASIA COMMAND HEADQUARTERS, Rangoon, Ceylon.—(AP)—British forces pursuing the Japanese beyond the captured Burmese frontier base of Tamu found no organized resistance today and they captured prisoners described officially as in a shocking state.

In the ruins of captured Myittha, long a Japanese base in North Burma which Gen. Joseph W. Stilwell captured last week, cities and Japanese losses were being listed. Fifty miles south of Tamu the Japanese were able to stage delaying attacks.

First troops entering Tamu reported finding more than 200 Japanese dead or dying from wounds and starvation in the nearby village of Basha. About the same number of similar casualties were found in a village to the north and along the Kachin valley roads.

Subsequent aerial attacks were made on strategic and tactical objectives, destroyed the monasteries. The victims of Tamu were pushed into the constant enemy units into North Burma.

French Mediterranean Evacuation Considered

NEW YORK.—A Presentation of the evacuation of the French Mediterranean coast, it is thought, would be made by the United States and British forces for the immediate evacuation of all those French civilians and troops.

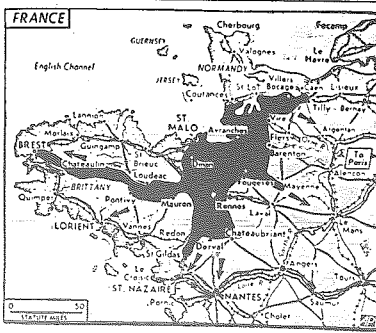
