WASHINGTON, Aug. 27 (AP)— Secretary of Agriculture Anderson today directed a revision of livestock ceilings which Department officials estimated will mean an increase of about six cents a pound in the retail price of beef, as compared with June 30 ceilings.

Beef Slated To Increase By 6 Cents

The retail prices of pork, they estimated, will rise an average of between 25 and three cents over June 30.
