October Draft Call Boosted 3,600

WASHINGTON — The Defense Department today raised its October draft call to 41,000 to 44,000 men. The additional 3,000 men will go to the Marine Corps, which has asked for 8,600 draftees in October. The remaining 36,000 will go into the Army.
