Girard Testimony MAEBASHI IP — A U. S. soldier testified today that William S. Girard asked him to lie about how many shots were fired when a Japanese woman was killed on an Army firing range.

Additional Sentence SREMSKA Mitrovia, Yugoslavia IP — Milovan Djilas, former vice president of Yugoslavia, was sentenced today to seven additional years in prison for writing hostile propaganda against Communism and the Yugoslav Government abroad.

Woman Killed SEOUL IP — The U. S. Army said today that a guard had shot and killed a Korean woman found stealing supplies. The announcement came as the Korean press denounced "careless shootings by American soldiers."

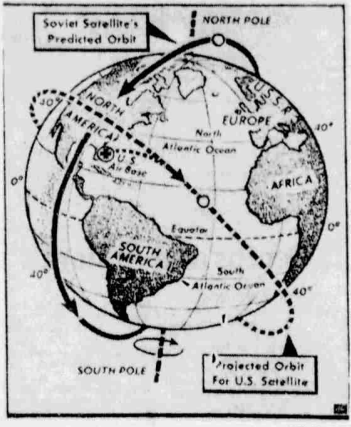

'Round Trip' Made Every 95 Minutes

By ASSOCIATED PRESS A Soviet-launched artificial moon raced around the earth today circling the globe every 95 minutes 560 miles out in space.

Scientists proclaimed the pioneer satellite the first dramatic step toward exploring the universe. Radio signals from the tiny moon were reported picked up in the United States, Britain, Canada and the Soviet Union.

'Simpler' Satellite Launched

WASHINGTON IP — A Russian scientist said today that Russia had two versions of an earth satellite in readiness and that apparently the simpler of them was chosen for launching.

NOT DECIDED

Blagonravov said that when he and his colleagues left Russia in late September to begin preparations for launching a satellite had been completed but "discussion was still going on as to which of two variants would be launched—two variants were prepared."
