AMMAN, Jordan. This is the ancient city against which King David sent Uriah the Hittite into battle after David saw Uriah's beautiful wife Bathsheba washing her hair on a rooftop. Uriah was killed in battle. David's henchmen bought off part of the Syrian army and the city of Amman was captured.

Today the little country of Jordan is truly the center of more international conspiracy than any in the Near East. It is also a police state. In driving from Amman to Jericho, a distance similar to that between Washington and Baltimore, I was stopped five times by troops to show my passport, even though I was in a United Nations car. U.S. officials were also had to show their passports.
