Democrats On Air

Adams Gone But Storm Continues

WASHINGTON — Sherman Adams is getting out but the political shooting over the assistant to the President is going right on.

That was apparent today in the wake of last night's nationwide broadcast in which President Eisenhower's No. 1 aide insisted "I have done no wrong" but announced he is leaving his post in "consideration of the effect of my continuing presence on the public scene."

Democratic national chairman Paul Butler will address the nation tonight on "The other side of the Adams case." The television and radio networks had granted free time to Adams to announce his resignation last night as assistant to the President. Butler contended the announcement was partisan and political and asked equal time.

CBS said it would carry Butler's speech over its television and radio networks from 5:35 to 6:45 p.m. (EST). The same time it carried the Adams speech.

NBC said it was ready to telecast and broadcast the Butler remarks, but this, it had not yet received any direct request to do so.

Most Republicans endeavored to dismiss the whole matter of Adams' relations with Boston time magazine Bernard Goldstone as one cleared up by Adams' exit, and to present Adams himself as a victim of sinners.

SHEWANDAH, Pa.

Five of the 12 teachers at West Mahoney Township High School were back at their desks today and more than 100 pupils were in the classrooms — but officially the school remained closed. Governors Disagree On Mixed Schooling

Conflicting Resolutions Suggested

LEXINGTON, Ky. — Southern governors were confronted today with confusion and conflict over a positive stand for the record on integrating schools.

At least two governors have said they will introduce opposing resolutions for consideration at their annual conference.

A formal expression on integration emerged as an issue when Republican Gov. Theodore B. McKeldin of Maryland proposed a resolution which, in effect, would bid Dixie governors on record as favoring it.

Georgia's Democratic Gov. Marvin Griffin came back with a proposal urging the adherence to protect the government "of the several states against all federal encroachment."

There was no indication when and if these resolutions actually would come up for a vote of the 14 governors attending the conference.

Graham To Direct Sermon At Youth Problems Today

Dr. Billy Graham will be searching into the hearts of young people tonight in the third service of his four-day Greater Charlotte Crusade.

The 7:30 p.m. meeting will be the first of two for youth, as each week the crusade will feature Tuesday and Thursday as youth nights.

Last night he held a colloquium audience of 12,300 persons.

Dr. Graham will be searching into the hearts of young people tonight in the third service of his four-day Greater Charlotte Crusade.

Dr. Graham read both the Third Commandment and Jesus' interpretation of that commandment before launching into his sermon.

He first read from Matthew 22:37-40, Jesus' interpretation: "And then one of them who was a lawyer asked him a question, tempting him and saying, Master, which is the great Commandment in the Law?"

Jesus said to him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment.

"And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Then Dr. Graham read Exodus 20:7 from the Old Testament: "Thou shalt not take the Name of the Lord thy God in vain; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that taketh His Name in vain."

"I could and I shall, before I leave, preach a sermon entitled, 'What is right about the church?' There is a great deal right about the church. But tonight I want to tell you what's wrong with the church."

"What's wrong with the church?" the evangelist asked as he began a sermon in which he told the worshippers the many ways they can, and have, taken the name of the Lord in vain.

"I believe that basically, the thing that's wrong with us today is that we are neglecting to live according to the Third Commandment."
