Canada Supports Eden Plan

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (CP)—Canada has suggested that Premier Minister Eden's plan for a try-out inspection of East-West armies in Europe as a preliminary to general disarmament be put into early operation.

"It seems to us his plan ought to be put into early effect," said Canadian Health Minister Paul Martin after Britain's Anthony Nutting outlined the plan.

British minister of state spelled out the Eden plan for the first time at Thursday's session of the United Nations disarmament sub-committee.

Harold Stassen, U.S. presidential adviser and Jules Moch of France also welcomed the plan. Soviet delegate Arkady A. Sobolev, considered it an important contribution worthy of study.

WOULD NAME COMMISSION

Under the proposed plan, representatives of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and the Soviet bloc would form a small committee with inspection powers at all military installations in an agreed area.

"I marked the third traffic fatality in the Riley family in the past six years," said the coroner.

"I was standing off the sidewalk when I saw him," said O'Connell. "He had hold of the wheel and was trying to get up. When I saw he was clear, I turned my head back up. Then I heard a crash and knew I had run over him."

Officials Say Federal Government Will Not Support Private Enterprise of Oil Pipeline

OTTAWA (CP)—The federal government will not support a private enterprise of an oil pipeline to be built by the Trans-Canada Pipe Lines Ltd., officials said today.

"We were commenting on a Toronto report that the Ontario provincial government was planning to carry Alberta's gas east by the Trans-Canada Pipe Lines Ltd.," said Prime Minister St. Laurent, as he commended a newspaperman's speculation.

Other officials said Trans-Canada Pipe Lines Ltd. is not a public utility and that the province has no right to build the line. It was too late to entertain any proposal which would eliminate the company.
