## Jurist Delivers Long Charge

GREENVILLE, S. C. —(AP)—Circuit Judge J. Robert Martin Jr. charged a Greenville County juror today "to see that a verdict is rendered that speaks the truth" in conviction or acquittal of 28 white men who are accused of lynching a Negro.

The dead included Col. Raymond E. O'Neill, 52, a 30-year Army veteran of both wars and AAF pilot expert, and Col. George A. Whaley, 48, who had served in the Army since 1925 and headed the Mobile Training Unit at Chautau Field, near Champaign, Illinois.

The newspaper's Washington correspondent said that final enactment of Senate-and-House approved omnibus labor bills would, if it was determined that Communists were influential in the local.
