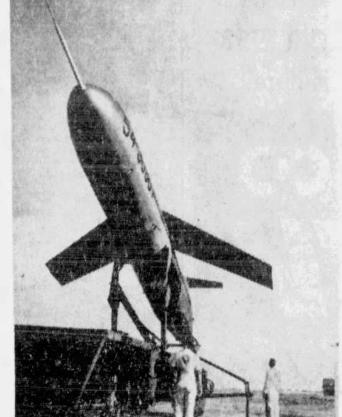

But unless the wire services are prepared to refer to snakes and black wid spiders as "beautiful," they should have a care with that adjective.

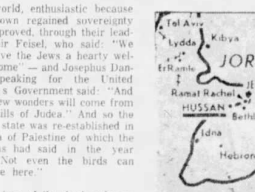
