Uncle Ray Some Lesser Stars Are Size of Planets

Last time I spoke about some of the supergiant stars now known. These include Antares, Alpha Herculis and VV Cephei. The diameter of VV Cephei is estimated to be about one billion miles, just even that size of the largest star known. In the far reaches of space is the dim star called Souther Aurigae (EP-314h ch-RYE-jee). It has two and a half times the diameter of VV Cephei, and three thousand times the diameter of the sun. If astronomers ever find an end to the star system, we may be able to name, surely and certainly, the largest star. Our best telescopes have failed to find such a limit to this date. Q. What is the difference between a giant star and a supergiant? A. This is the general rule: a giant star has from 10 to 100 times the diameter of the sun, but a supergiant has from 100 to three thousand times the diameter. If any stars are found to have more than three thousand times the sun's diameter, they may be classed among the supergiants or some other name (indicating their fantastic size) may be used for them. Q. Are there any stars which are smaller than the sun? A. Many stars are smaller than the sun. Some have one-tenth

WASHINGTON (AP) — Night club singer Tommy Leonetti Monday asked a quickly received Labor-Management Committee permission to give the United States Citizenship Commission a hearing on the underworld. Chairman John L. McClellan (D-Ark.) has not yet been determined whether Leonetti will come in person or submit his story by a sworn statement. Robert F. Kennedy, committee counsel, said Leonetti had sent word he could not testify either Tuesday or Wednesday because of conflicting appointments. Kennedy said he had received a telegram Monday afternoon asking to be heard and also received a phone call from Leonetti's manager, Dick Link.
